### 1. Investments:

Constitutional Capital Partners Ironsides Opportunities Fund II: a. Chair Lutton presented the recommendation of Investment Committee to invest \$10M into CCPIOF II.

> Upon motion by Trustee Lutton and second by Trustee Despres, the investment was unanimously approved.

# 2. <u>Personnel/ Audit</u>:

- a. Executive Director's Contract: Mr. Burney briefed the Board on proposed contract for Mr. Bounds. Upon motion by Trustee Lutton and second by Trustee Trevino, the Board unanimously approved the contract for Mr. Bounds.
- b. <u>Strategic Business Planning Committee Meeting</u>: Chair Berry reported on establishing a process for review of performance for Mr. Bounds. Mr. Bounds was requested to draft an Organizational Chart for all employees.

Mr. Bounds reported on 7-year lease proposal for a new health care family practice tenant at Rogers Road Campus. Third-party consultant and Mr. Bounds will review and report back to the Committee.

### 3. Benefits:

- a. <u>Alternative Therapy List</u>: Ms. Puga reported on proposed changes to the Alternative Therapy List, effective August 1, 2023, as recommended by Welldyne. No current members will be affected by these changes.
- b. <u>Intercept Program</u>: There are no changes to the Intercept Program List.
- 4. <u>Legislative</u>: ESG Bill that as originally filed would affect fiduciary duty to Fund to make investments died.

# 5. <u>Administrative Report</u>:

a. <u>Expenses:</u> Mr. Bounds presented the expenditures for the Fund. Upon motion by Trustee Sanchez and second by Trustee Despres, a list of expenses and claims and the Financial Report were unanimously approved by the Board.

# 6. <u>Consultant Report:</u>

- a. <u>Legal</u>: No report.
- b. <u>Actuarial Report</u>: Foster & Foster reported on the results of the Actuarial Experience study. Foster & Foster reviewed all assumptions and recommended assumption changes in four areas: salary; retirement rates; withdrawal rates; and spousal coverage. Mortality rates for public safety is higher than general public.

Projected long-term return is 8.08% (5.3% return and 2.75% inflation).

COSA public service has the lowest withdrawal rate of any public system Foster & Foster follows, and they also retire later. Nationwide withdrawal rates are in the 4-5% range.

Upon motion by Trustee Sanchez and second by Trustee Despres, the Board unanimously approved the recommended changes in assumptions, resulting in net decrease (1.54%) in minimum required contribution as a percentage of payroll, which will be used in the FY 23 actuarial study (to be presented in August, 2023).
